Nominations Committee, which requires a minimum of 3 members, and is responsible for presenting the slate of candidates for Executive positions to the general membership. If there are multiple candidates, they will also oversee the voting process at the AGM in May. The Chair of this Committee must come from the general membership; it cannot be a member of the Executive. Please be mindful that our club cannot operate without the time and energy of the members who volunteer to fill these necessary roles. Please put some thought into joining this committee. We will also be looking for members to fill various positions on next year's Executive and hope you will consider this as well. This year, there are no proposed resolutions from CFUW National. Instead, they are inviting clubs to consider a list of key issues that they anticipate will appear on party platforms and in debates during the 2019 Federal Election. As a club, we are asked to provide feedback on what we consider to be the top five issues. From club input, CFUW National will choose the most relevant topics and develop backgrounders and talking points for each issue. Members and clubs will be able to use this information when they meet candidates or at All Candidates' Meetings. As the deadline for us to submit our ideas is March 31, 2019, we will be devoting the March meeting to a discussion and prioritization of these issues. #### **News from National**

#### Montreal Massacre:

December 6, 2018 was the 29th anniversary of the Ecole Polytechnique Massacre and it was recognized by CFUW National.

#### Status of Women Canada:

On December 13, 2018 the Status of Women Canada became a department of the government of Canada and is no longer an agency within the Department of Heritage.

#### Resolutions in Action:

In preparation for the upcoming 2019 election CFUW has asked clubs to consider a list of key issues and provide input as to which are the most pressing. CFUW National will then, based upon club input, develop updated backgrounders and talking points for eliciting candidate positions.

#### The topics are:

- 1. The economy -pay equity, women in non-traditional occupations, universal children, parental leave, poverty, housing;
- 2. Pharmacare;
- Environment & climate change;
- 4. Elections & election reform;
- Indigenous issues-missing and murdered women, education

- 6. Immigration;
- 7. Women's issues.

#### CFUW Book Naming Contest:

A history of CFUW is in the works so if you can think of a snappy or catchy title there will be a contest to name the book. Details will be announced at a later date.

#### GWI:

GWI has indicated willingness to negotiate with CFUW to try and iron out the differences between the two organizations.

#### Organizational issues:

The governance committee is looking at policy on filling vacancies and ensuring the provisions of governing documents are met in the face of board and regional director vacancies.

#### 100th Anniversary AGM:

Planning continues and a list of tours will be available sometime this month.

#### Membership:

Nationally 516 members were lost from 2017 to 2018.


the first and third Thursday of the month. Dian will host the next game of her choice on January 17<sup>th.</sup>


The Creative Cookery group met at the Brantford Golf and Country club for our annual Christmas Dinner.
