Message from the Leadership Team

Trivia Night is still a few days away but, as you are reading this, Trivia Night will be a few days in the past. I would like to thank all our members who help make this night a success each year. We look forward to hearing Lynn H's report of the details of this initiative at the February General Meeting.

At our General Meeting in January, we voted on whether to include time for community announcements in our meeting agendas, or whether to continue posting announcements on our community board. It was decided to continue with the bulletin board method, but also to encourage members to use our newsletter as a means of getting the word out. Several new initiatives were also discussed and voted on at the January meeting. The first is a "linen drive" that the Advocacy Committee has organized to help Brantford's Why Not Youth Centre and which supports, at the local level, the CFUW National resolution to End Youth Homelessness. We will be collecting new or gently used linens over the next few months (think towels, bedsheets, tea towels, receiving blankets etc.). If you are unable to bring your contributions to the general meeting, contact Betsy and she will arrange a pick-up. The second new initiative is an exciting one! To celebrate the 100th anniversary of CFUW, we have decided to give a special scholarship this year! It was determined that this would be funded by donations from members, with a matching amount (up to \$1000) contributed from club funds. This scholarship will be given to a graduating female student from an area high school who exhibits characteristics such as respect, openmindedness and tolerance. I very much want to thank the Scholarship Committee of Lynne D., Lorraine L., Colette W. and Marla M. who readily accepted the idea of a new scholarship and then put the necessary time and effort into developing a plan to make this happen on a very short timeline.

Donations for the Centenary Scholarship will be accepted until April 1st. Please write "100th anniversary scholarship" on the memo line of your cheque and give it to Nora L or any member of the Scholarship Committee. Be sure to attend the Spring Banquet and Annual General Meeting when this scholarship will be awarded!

Also in celebration of our 100th anniversary, Lynn H. will be submitting a request to have CFUW honoured in a community garden. We don't know yet whether or not this will be successful, as other submissions will be reviewed by the Parks and Recreation department and they will make the final choice. Thank you to Lynn for the original idea and for making the submission on our behalf.

We have also decided to get a new updated banner for the anniversary since our old one is in a sorry state of disrepair. If you have any ideas re a design, be sure to give us your input. And, of course, cake!! There will be a special anniversary cake at some point in our future!

The Advocacy Committee is excited to announce that we are supporting the International Women's Day event being put on by the Grand River Grannies of the Grandmothers to Grandmothers Campaign. The slogan for the Anniversary is: 100 Years of CFUW – The Power of Women Working Together.

Since its founding in 1919, the Canadian Federation of University Women (CFUW) has had a significant impact on the social, political, economic and especially educational opportunities of thousands of Canadian women. It brought together, into a national federation, several similar organizations and in turn, helped found the International Federation of University Women (now known as Graduate Women International). The CFUW itself and many of its affiliates began providing scholarships in 1921, and the CFUW continues to award \$1 million dollars each year to encourage women to pursue advanced education. Believing that well-educated women who took a leadership role in university life, the professions, politics and society could, by their example, dispel prejudice against women in leadership positions, the Federation encouraged its members to further their education, run for political office and seek high-profile appointments. In 1966-67, the CFUW called for a royal commission on the status of women, and continued for many years afterward to pressure the federal government to implement its recommendations. From its beginning, the CFUW has played an important national role in offering academic scholarships, lobbying for academic appointments for women, performing service work in the community and helping to make Canada a more equitable place for women.

How is CFUW celebrating?

Nationally:

In addition to the Annual General Meeting to be held in Winnipeg in August at the same hotel as the founding meeting, there will be the Notable Women Awards, the Sage Awards, the unveiling of a CFUW plague by the Government of Canada, the additional \$100,000 to be given out for the 100th Anniversary Scholarships, the 100thAnniversary Membership Campaign; the advocacy initiative for 2019 on Grandparents for Childcare and the publication of the CFUW History book.

- special cake at the April General Meeting or at the AGM
- a new banner for the Club with a new design and maybe with the 100 year logo
- local scholarship for the 100th year anniversary.

At the January meeting it was approved that the General Fund will match the donations of the membership up to but not exceeding \$1000.00.
