Summary of CFUW press release of March 21,2019 concerning the federal budget:

1. \$160 million dollars over the next five years has been designated in the federal budget for the Women's Program overseen by the Ministry of Women and Gender Equality, with 75 percent of the funding to be withheld until 2022-2023.

2. The federal budget made no commitment to universal child care.

3. The federal budget committed to subsidizing the cost of zero-emission vehicles, phasing out coal fired power generation and promoting energy efficiency. However, this alone will not enable Canada to meet its commitment to the Paris Climate Agreement to reduce greenhouse gas emissions to 45 percent below 2010 levels by 2030.

4. A federal Anti-racism Strategy Secretariat was created.

5. \$4.5 billion dollars over the next 5 years has been committed to fund indigenous services and uphold Jordan's Principle & another \$739 million over 5 years to improve water systems in First Nations Communities; however, there was no new funding dedicated to housing on First Nations Reserves.

6. \$35 million over 4 years has been set aside to establish a "Canadian Drug Agency Transition Office" to be followed by an additional \$500 million per year starting in 2022-2023, to enable Canadians with rare diseases to access medications. CFUW hopes that this is a precursor to pharma care and notes that Canada has a patchwork system and is the only country with a universal health care system that does not cover medications. 




