## **News from National**

II. Notes about the Board meeting of 5-12-19

Note the official minutes will be posted following the January Board meeting. Summaries have been provided after meetings to keep members updated.

- 1. The list of 20 CFUW delegates to the 64th session of the UN Commission on the Status of Women (UN-CSW64) being held at New York March 2020 has been approved. A spot was reserved for a speaker should it be needed, otherwise it will open a spot for another delegate. Other members who applied have been informed that they may attend, unofficially, the parallel sessions off the UN Building site, and join in collegial activities with the official CFUW delegation.
- 2. The report on the Visioning Session held at the August AGM resulted in the Board accepting short term and long-term priorities. The three short term priorities for 2019-20 are: Helping clubs with social media. (There will be a Club webinar in early January on social media).

Helping clubs to learn about what other clubs are doing in advocacy so that they can share information.

Reaching out to the North of Canada

3. The Committee to Identify Funding for the GWI Shortfall reported with an extensive list of options. The recommendation was to start with a "direct ask" of Clubs. This was accepted and will be initiated in January and will be voluntary.

4. CFUW will await financial reports as per the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) before we pay our 2020 membership fees to GWI.

(Since the meeting, we have heard from GWI that they can organize early in 2020 a webinar on GWI finances and reporting. We have contacted GWI and explained the need for financial records that all members can understand. The dues requirements are 50% by March 30, 2020 with the balance by June 30, 2020.)

5. Other GWI news:

The 2019 Triennial Minutes will be completed, voted on and published by the end of December. GWI will hold a webinar on Bina Roy in early 2020.

- 6. The Board approved the policies on Election procedures, International Representation and Standing Committees as presented by the Governance Committee. The policies will be published later.
- 7. A payment plan was agreed on for Clubs unable to pay the \$6.00 Per Capita increase immediately.
- 8. The Chair of Articles and Bylaws reviewed areas of the Articles and Bylaws in need of change.
- 9. The Executive Director's report (see email from Lynn H.) National President-Presidente Nationale FUW-FCFDU

Thank you to all of you who answered the Survey. We are so pleased that members from 44 of our 49 clubs participated. This has given us some real information that we can use both for advocacy and for planning. A report on the results will be forthcoming early in the new year, as well as the Ontario Council comments based on this survey to the government concerning the 2020 Pre-Budget consultations.
