Ontario Council AGM Report

Ontario Council AGM took place on May 13, 2023 via Zoom. The chair was Teresa Habs, V.P. Ontario Some of the more interesting tidbits are as follows:

Membership across the province is up by 124 new members and there are over 4000 members across the province.

There is an Advocacy Corner on the Ontario Council website where there is an exchange of information about activities of the different clubs so that ideas for advocacy can be shared between clubs or clubs with similar interests can work together. Ontario Council dues are \$5.50

Due to Zoom meetings Ontario Council spent only about \$11,000 of the \$21,217 budgeted for the 2022 and the anticipated 2023-2024 budget is \$23,238. There has been a surplus for the past 3 years due to the lack of in person meetings/AGM and the associated costs of same.

The Speaker's Series is on Zoom to allow for greater opportunities for participation for all members across the province. The attendance has increased for some of the speakers to over 100 attendees with the series being held via Zoom. Upon request a copy of the speakers' presentation can be obtained.

Joy Hurst, CFUW National President was the speaker and spoke of various issues, including membership (6633 members) a collaboration between Mexico, US and Canadian national organizations regarding migration of peoples, membership in Women, Peace and Security, and the importance of reconciliation. Joy invited all to attend an advocacy think tank being held in June, and re-branding efforts.


